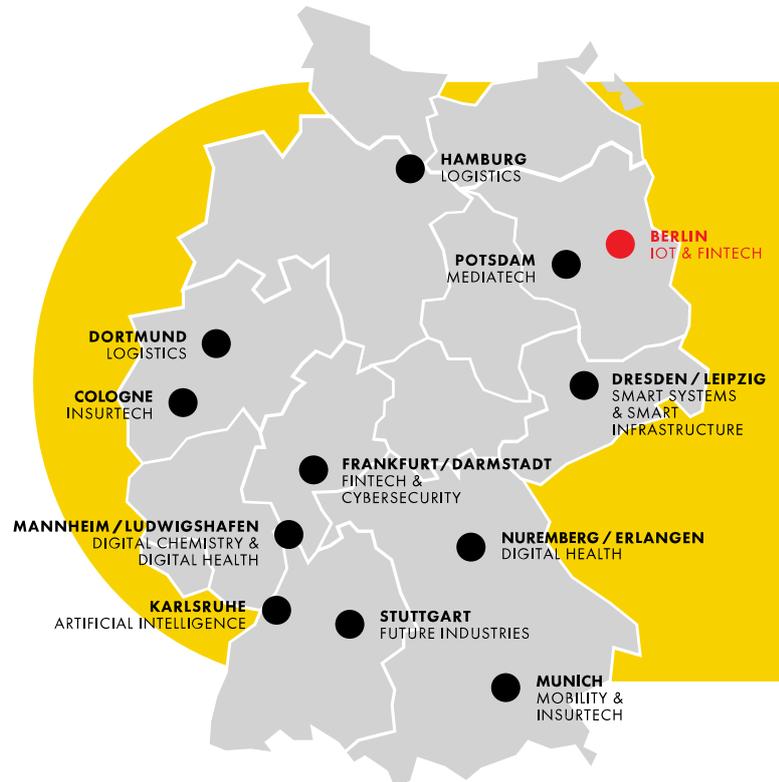

1. MotionLab.Berlin Hardtech Innovation Hub & Makerspace

Motion.Lab Berlin is a partner of the IoT Hub and provides with its space as a Hardtech Innovation Hub and Makerspace with access to an exclusive pool of machines for prototyping and co-working. The MotionLab.Berlin offers young founders an optimal environment for successful project realisation and company development through its unique infrastructure.

2. MakeUp Internet of Things
